I am writing to inform you of NDI's plans for observing the December 14, 1989 Chilean elections.

NDI expects to sponsor a 30-member international delegation the elections. The delegation will be led by Adolfo Suarez, served as a co-leader of NDI's international observer delega for the plebiscite. Many of the other participants will be f countries that are seeking to initiate democratic transition Having been close observers of the Chilean political process three years now, NDI believes there is a good deal that can learned from the Chilean experience.

The present schedule calls for the observers to arrive on December 11. I would hope that you could brief the delegatio December 12 in the morning. I also hope that on Saturday, December 15 you will be able to participate in a round table discussion amongst the international observers and various Chileans.

We have spoken with the Chilean Embassy in Washington regard the delegation and it is supportive of the effort. I will be touch by telephone shortly. I look forward to seeing you in Santiago.
